School and Community

Edgewood High School is a public high school that serves students in grades 9-12. In addition to Edgewood High School, the Buckeye Local School District includes 2 elementary schools (K-5), and one middle school (6-8). BLSD is located about an hour east of Cleveland in a rural area along the coast of Lake Erie.

Class Ranking

Graduation Requirements

24 Total Credits Required for Graduation

- English:** 4 credits (English I, II, III, and IV)
- Math:** 4 credits (including Algebra II +)
- Science:** 3 credits (including 1 physical science and 1 biological science)
- Social Studies:** 3 credits (including 1 Government, 1 U.S. History and 1 World History)
- Health:** ½ credit
- PE:** ½ credit or Waiver
- Fine Arts:** 1/2 credit
- Technology:** 1 credit
- Financial Literacy:** 1/2 credit

Competency: Earn a passing score on Algebra I and English II tests. 4 additional ways: 1) Demonstrate Career Readiness, 2) Complete College Coursework 3) Enlist in the Military, 4) ACT/SAT

Readiness: Earn 2 diploma seals (1 state seal). **State Seals:** OhioMeansJobs Readiness, Industry-Recognized Credential, College-Ready, Military Enlistment, Citizenship, Science, Honors Diploma, Biliteracy, Technology. **Local Seals:** Community Service Seal, Fine and Performing Arts Seal, Student Engagement Seal.

D = 60 – 69	F = 59 and below	

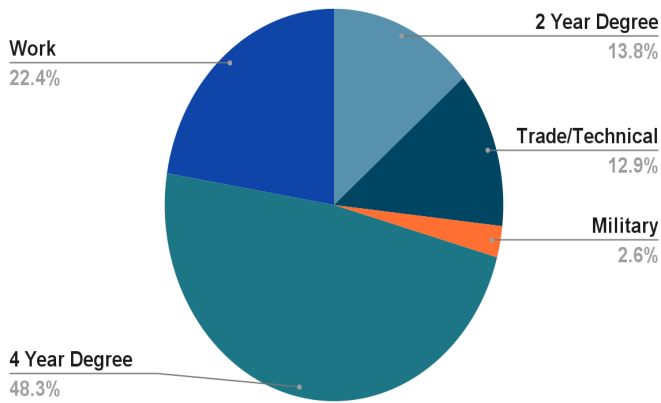

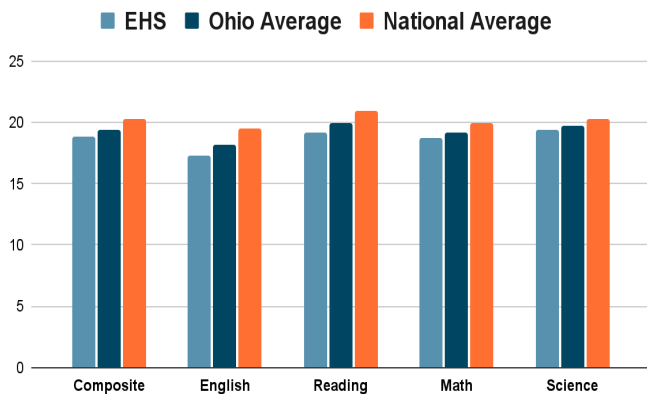

Students in grades 7-12 who meet college readiness benchmarks are able to take college classes that count for both high school and college credit. Edgewood High School averages about 30-40 students per year who participate in this program. For the 2023-24 school year, we are offering College Writing I, College Writing II, Great Books I, and Great Books II taught in the building through Kent State University—Ashtabula Campus.

Ashtabula County Career & Technical Campus

Serves 7 public school districts and 1 private school in Ashtabula County. Students have the opportunity to earn industry recognized credentials that will assist in gaining employment after graduation. In addition, most programs have an articulation agreement with Lakeland Community College, Kent State University, or the University of Akron.
