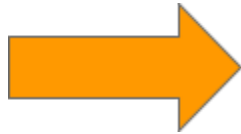
The Library Nook






